OBID is grateful to our over 250-member property and business owners along with members of Pittsburgh City Council and Mayor Ed Gainey who worked together to enact the continued designation of the BID. We endeavor to continue to provide the excellent level of service that brings tremendous benefit to the thousands of local, national and international populations that choose to live, work, study and play in Oakland.

Our report shares the many activities and accomplishments of our OBID team working alongside our many business and property owners, our university, hospital, civic and government partners together focused on maintaining the strength of Pittsburgh's most vital economic center.

We are in the business of place making and in 2022 we maintained our focus of keeping Oakland safe, clean, vital and welcoming while forging new and innovative strategies and solutions to help our district thrive. Understanding that our businesses were still coping with the impact of the pandemic, we expanded the popular outdoor dining program with a new more attractive three season patio deck system that provides 400 lineal feet of cafe space along four commercial corridors. Popular with customers, Oakland's outdoor dining provides an attractive and green space to dine and to hang out. In 2022, we unveiled the Sidewalk Poetry program where 25 poems by 21 local poets were "published" on sidewalks throughout Oakland. This interactive public art project featured poetry that celebrates Oakland's past, present and future. OBID also unveiled GLOWLAND, a month-long winter festival featuring art installations, live music events and illuminations throughout Oakland. The festival was anchored by the internationally acclaimed Impulse, an interactive installation comprising of 15 illuminated, sound-producing seesaws that transformed Oakland into a winter playground.

Our placemaking and beautification efforts continue to be anchored by our daily Sidewalk Cleaning program that keeps Oakland's sidewalks and public spaces clean and ready for our visitors throughout the year and by our various marketing initiatives promoting our many restaurant and retail establishments. Each of these innovative efforts were part of a strategy to ramp up our digital marketing efforts leading to off the charts increase in audience engagement: we saw a 77% increase in Facebook impressions, a 169% increase in Twitter posts engagement and our email newsletter campaign open rate increased by 41%, click rate increased by 400% to name a few.

Reaching pre-pandemic levels, in 2022 Oakland saw over 1 million visitors, reinforcing the strength and vitality of our community. OBID is here for you. We are grateful for your support and we look forward to continuing the charge to shape and activate Oakland's public life.



OBID's Ambassador Cleaning Program provides a variety of daily services throughout the year to maintain a clean, vibrant and attractive business district.

- Sweeps 23,000 lineal feet of sidewalk (4.4 miles) and 1,400 lineal feet of alley
- Collects over 18.5 tons of Trash,
 52000 cigarettes, over 3,000 pizza
 boxes and removes over 900 pieces
 of graffiti
- Seasonal Washing of over 120 storefront sidewalks (20% repeat 2-3x)



Activating Oakland
Sidewalk Poetry



In 2022, we unveiled the Sidewalk Poetry program, an interactive public art project featuring poetry that celebrates Oakland's past, present and future. Sidewalk poetry has spread to other cities across the country to honor the intersection between poetry and place. Over 82 poems were submitted as part of a public contest and each were reviewed and selected blindly by a panel of jurors comprised of Oakland's residents and representatives from University of Pittsburgh, CMU, and Carlow University. The Committee chose 21 local poets who were awarded a stipend and whose art was "published" on sidewalks throughout Oakland. 
